FUNERAL MASSES

In order to protect the congregation and the celebrant from the risk of contracting / passing the infection from COVID-19 the Diocese has suggested the following guideline for Funeral Masses:

- A maximum of **10 people** in the Church. This should be discussed with the family and/or Undertaker when making arrangements and they can decide who will be in the church.
- Use one designated door at the church which is closed and only opened when those attending arrive.
- The designated people enter the church first and take their places observing physical distancing.
- The coffin is then brought into the church and the door closed.
- It would be useful if the time of the Requiem Mass was not published.
- A Mass can be offered when these restrictions are lifted which will give the community a chance to sympathise and pray for the deceased.
- At the burial everyone to observe social distancing.

EVERYONE MUST STAY AT HOME until Easter Sunday in all circumstances except for the following:

- travel to work for an essential service which cannot be done from home.
- Shopping for groceries or collect food.
- Vital family reasons.
- farming purposes.
- visiting those who need care.

All public or private gatherings outside a household are prohibited.

This includes social and family visits which are not for the above reasons.

- All visits to hospitals, residential health care settings, prisons will cease except for compassionate grounds
 - Shielding or cocooning will be introduced for over 70's and specified categories of people. Detailed guidance to be offered.
 - Only residents to travel to offshore islands
 - Public transport will be limited to those offering essential services - no travel outside 2km of your home for any reason.
- Emergency response will be ramped up

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

5 April **St Vincent Ferrer** (1350 - 1419) was born in Valencia and joined the Dominicans at the age of 17. In 1399, with the approval of the Pope, he set out on his mission as a preacher. For twenty years he travelled through western Europe, with thousands flocking to hear him wherever he was. From 1408 he worked mostly south of the Pyrenees. Among others, he preached to the Jews, of whom some 25,000 were converted to Christianity; and in the Kingdom of Granada he converted thousands of Moors. In 1417 he moved on to Brittany and continued his work there: he died in Vannes in Brittany on 5 April 1419.

7 April **St John Baptist de la Salle** (1651 - 1719) was born in Rheims in France in 1651. He became a priest and devoted himself wholeheartedly to the education of children, founding schools for the poor. He and his colleagues formed a congregation called the Brothers of the Christian Schools, in whose cause he suffered many tribulations. He died in Rouen in 1719.

11 April **St Stanisław** (1036 - 1079) was born in Szczepanów in Poland in about 1036. He studied at Liège, was ordained, and in 1072 became bishop of Kraków. He ruled the church as a good shepherd, gave help to the poor, and performed annual visitations to supervise the clergy. He reproached King Bolesław II for his crimes and vices and at length excommunicated him. Bolesław sought him out, and murdered him as he was celebrating Mass on 8 May 1079.
