FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

1 May - **St Joseph the Worker** exemplifies the holiness of human labour.

2 May - **St Athanasius** (295 - 373) was born in Alexandria. He assisted Bishop Alexander at the Council of Nicaea and later succeeded him as bishop. He fought hard against Arianism (which taught that the Son was created by the Father and in no way equal to him) all his life, undergoing many sufferings and spending a total of 17 years in exile. He wrote outstanding works to explain and defend orthodoxy.

3 May - **Saints Philip and James**, Apostles.

St Philip was born at Bethsaida and started as a disciple of John the Baptist. After the death of John the Baptist he followed Christ.

St James, a cousin of the Lord, was the son of Alphaeus. He ruled the Church at Jerusalem; wrote an epistle. He led an austere life; and converted many Jews to the Faith. He was crowned with martyrdom in the year 62.

4 May - **St Conleth** (- 519) was an Irish hermit and metalworker who was persuaded by St Brigid to act as priest for her monastic community in Kildare. He became the first Bishop of Kildare in around 490. In 519 he set out on pilgrimage to Rome but was attacked by wolves in the forests of Leinster and died on 4 May 519.

5 May - **Blessed Edmund Rice** (1762 - 1844) Following the death of his wife in 1789, he devoted himself to prayer and good works, in particular to the education of the poor in his home town of Waterford. He founded schools, and undertook the training of teachers. In 1808 he and six companions took religious vows. He is the founder of the Presentation Brothers and the Christian Brothers.

6 May - **St François de Laval** (1623 - 1708) was the first bishop of New France (Canada). He founded a seminary and had schools and churches built. He was canonized by Pope Francis on 3 April 2014.

7 May - **Blessed Catherine of Saint Augustine** (1632 - 1668) was born in France. She joined the Augustinian Hospitaller Sisters of the Mercy of Jesus in 1651 and volunteered to go to their mission in Quebec where she spent her life ministering to the poor and sick.

FIRST COMMUNION & FIRST CONFESSIONS DEFERRED UNTIL SEPTEMBER

The announcement by the Taoiseach has provided some clarity in relation to the return to public worship. The Government website also stated that it was 'advised' that Confirmation and First Communion ceremonies should not take place at present. The Taoiseach did state that the difficulty was not with the ceremony itself but with what happened later. In that context, the Diocese of Meath is strongly suggesting that First Holy Communion Ceremonies in parishes be deferred until September.
