FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

25 May **Pope St Gregory VII** (1020 - 1085) was born in Tuscany. He became a monk, and assisted several successive Popes in reforming the Church. He was elected pope in 1073. He fought to free the Church from harmful influences and dependence on the state. This brought him into conflict with the Emperor Henry IV. As a result he suffered and finally died in exile.

25 May **St Mary Magdalen of Pazzi** (1566 - 1607) was an Italian Carmelite nun who devoted her life to prayer. She is remembered for proclaiming the urgent need for all people to awaken to God's love, and respond in kind.

25 May **St Bede the Venerable** (673 - 735) was a monk and historian of the early English Church, and master of the Scriptures and of the teachings of the Church Fathers. Known for his scholarly writings. He was venerated as the "light of the Church" in the period called the Dark Ages and as a forerunner of the eighth and ninth century renaissance of the Western Church. Venerable Bede was the last of the early church fathers.

26 May **St Philip Neri** (1515 - 1595) was born in Florence. He was an outstanding proponent of Church reform after the Council of Trent. Worked among the young and the poor in Rome and founded the Congregation of the Oratory. Honoured as a spiritual director, for his pastoral initiatives, for his humour, simplicity, and charity. 27 May **St Augustine of Canterbury** was a Benedictine monk who was sent by Pope Gregory to minister to the Anglo Saxons in 596. He became the first Archbishop of Canterbury in the year 597. He is considered the "Apostle to the English" and a founder of the English Church.
