FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

17 Oct – **St Ignatius of Antioch** (c.37-107) bishop and martyr, was an early martyr, who is known from the seven letters he wrote to various churches in Asia Minor on his way to martyrdom in Rome.

18 Oct - **St Luke**, Evangelist, Missionary, is named as the author of the Third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. He wrote to reassure those who had grown uncertain toward the end of the first century. In his gospel, the compassion of Christ is inclusive of all: Gentile and Jew, the poor and the rich, women and men, the outcast and the privileged.

19 Oct – **Saints John de Brébeuf** (1593-1649) and **Isaac Jogues** (1607-1646) and **companions - The Jesuit Martyrs of North America**. Against a background of conflict between French and English and between Huron, Mohawk, and Iroquois, they went as missionaries teaching the message of Christ in the local languages. The Iroquois Indians seized Brébeuf and his fellow Jesuit Gabriel Lallemond and tortured them until they died.

20 Oct – **St Paul of the Cross** (1694-1775) founder of the Passionists, was noted for his preaching in parish missions, for calling sinners to repentance, and for his gifts of healing.

21 Oct - **St Fintan**. There seem to have been at least two Fintans in the ancient Irish Church, one associated with Clonenagh in Co. Laois and another with Taghmon in south Co. Wexford, who is also called St Munnu.

22 Oct – **St John Leonardi** (1542-1609) priest and reformer, was born in Tuscany, Italy. He was a priest who was inspired by the reforming spirit of the Council of Trent. He also inspired the founding of the College of Propaganda Fide in Rome, where St Oliver Plunkett was educated and taught before he returned to Ireland.

24 Oct – **St Anthony Mary Claret** (1807-70) archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, was born in Spain. He spent more than a decade preaching missions and retreats in Catalonia, and founded a religious institute, later known as the Claretians, for this work. He was appointed archbishop of Santiago (Cuba) where he aroused opposition for his spiritual and social reforms and for championing the rights of the indigenous peoples. As chaplain to Queen Isabella II, he drew the arts and sciences into his missionary endeavour.
